

Double Exposure Image

Get the image into the PShop frame that you want to work from.
Follow the directions below.

Control A (select all)

Control C (copy)

Open a new image

Control V (paste)

Change the opacity in the bottom right for the layers

{ smaller brush end

} bigger brush end

Control J to duplicate the layer

Control, shift and U together to change to black and white

Press E to erase

Control + to zoom in

Control, shift and E to merge the visible layers – this will put all of the images into one so that you can save it as a single layer.

To create a nice white (blurred) boarder to the picture (Old style.)

Put your photo into PShop that you want to create into a blended boarder.

Feather – default = 0px

A good one to use here is 25/30 etc.

Photo – rectangular marquee tool (or other shape depending on what shape you want ie oval)

Select the area

Control, shift and I together to invert the marching ants.

Delete

Chose foreground colour, background colour (ie white – 100% gets to quite strong)

Click on OK.

For a Big canvas –

Paste the image onto a blank canvas (10X8 inches and 300 dpi to print is best)

Deselect - Control D

Select all

Copy

Paste onto a new layer.

NB – Control, Alt and Z together to go backwards

To add an image into the picture and blend to make it realistic.

Press Q

Brush tool (B)

Size of brush – hard round pressure opacity, softer brush ie 20%

Go over the image that you want to select (it will come out red for the area that you are going over.)

Press Q again

Control, shift and I together to select the area needed

Control C (copy)

Get the image that you want to put the selection into

Control V Paste into the new photo

Control T (transform) this changes the image selection by one pixel.

Press E (eraser)

Hard round pressure opacity

The opacity is needed to be changed also to feather to get a more subtle edge.

NB – Control, Alt and Z together to go backwards

Black and White with Colour

Click on the picture

Control J (to duplicate the image)

Click on the adjustment pre-set scroll down to lighter

Shift and click on both layers (pre-set layer and image layer)

Control & E

Eraser to go over the image for colour

Remember to use the feather tool and opacity.

Zoom in to produce more detailed work.

To lighten and rectify the image

Get the image up

Control and J together to duplicate the image

Control and M to bring up the curves meter

Change the line to create a curve.

Lighter at the top and darker at the bottom. (grey at the top)

Produce a curve if possible.

Reduce shadow by dragging the curve from the right to left.

Auto adjust also available.
